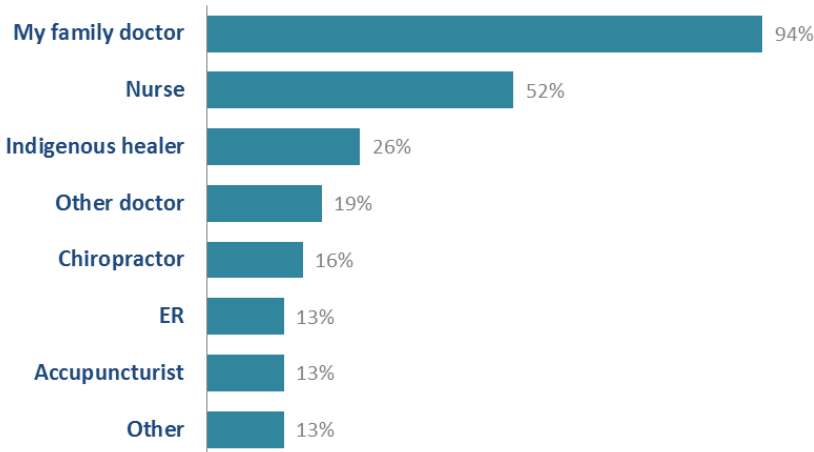

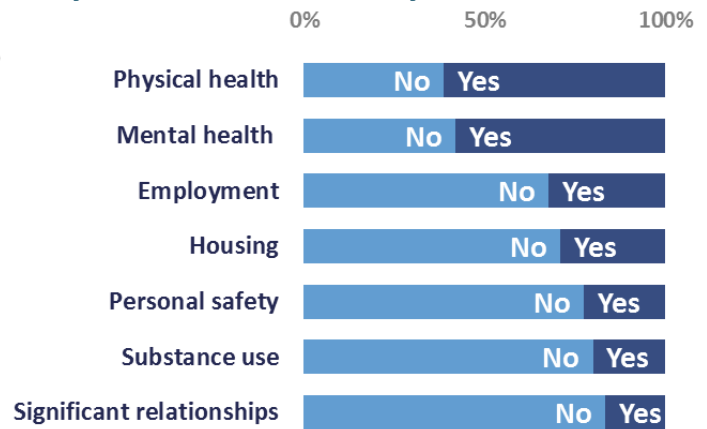

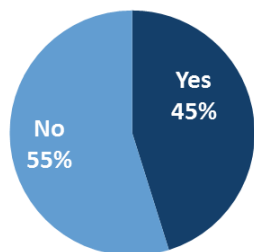
Using the Emergency Room

Do you have a chronic condition?

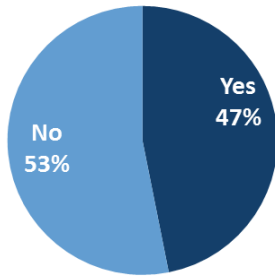


How much does your chronic condition interfere with everyday life?

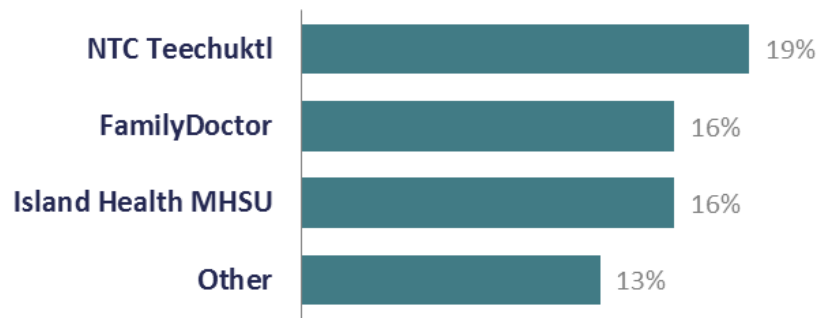

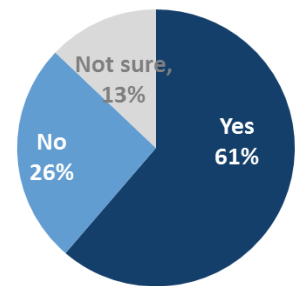
